



State Tournament Rules & Regulations

Tournament Committee:

The tournament committee is a standing committee governed by the Board of Directors.

The tournament committee shall be comprised of nine members:

- 1) Vice-President, committee chair
- 2) Officials' Representative
- 3) Board of Directors member
- 4) Tournament Director
- 5-6) Appointed by the OWPOA
- 7-9) Appointed by the Board of Directors

Three members shall be free of conflicts of interest in the girls and boys tournament (not necessarily the same members). At least three members, without a conflict of interest in a particular game, shall be witnesses to said game. The Tournament Committee shall rule on questions, disputes, or protests at the State Tournament.

Rules Committee

The Rules Committee will be compromised of the Table Official and one member of the voting Board of OHSWPC & the Head Official or his representative.(Added by Board 6/25/96)

Competition Format:

As shown in appendix. The order of games may change yearly based on the site of the tournament. The first team listed shall wear dark caps and be the home team for that game.

Team Information:

Only the head coach, one assistant coach, a team statistician or manager, the eighteen players A certified medical trainer is permitted at any time. Teams and coaches must remain in the team area during play. Caps shall be numbered 1 - 18.

Conduct and Discipline:

- a) A referee who has ejected a player for brutality shall provide the tournament committee with a written report of the incident within fifteen minutes following the game.
- b) The tournament committee has the authority to prevent a player or coach from further competition in the tournament or a portion thereof.
- c) All findings of this committee shall be handled timely and considered final and without appeal, due to the immediacy of necessary action. A full report shall be made to the Board of Directors by the chair of the tournament committee.
- d) The Oregon High School Water Polo Committee will not tolerate any physical or verbal abuse toward officials, staff, or tournament organizers before, during or after any part of the tournament. Any physical or verbal abuse reported to the Tournament Committee may automatically warrant a tournament suspension to the offender. Further sanctions may apply pending review of the incident.
- e) Balloons, noisemakers, and banners, (other than those approved tournament sponsors) are NOT allowed in the tournament facility.
- f) The high school principal, coach and other responsible officials of each member school shall take all reasonable measures to insure that the schools students and supporters maintain a sportsmanlike attitude toward events so that events may be conducted without unreasonable danger or disorder.
- g) When the students, staff or supporters of any member school engage in un-sportsmanlike conduct, disorder or infliction of damage to persons or property in connection with any festival, meet, contest or tournament sponsored by the OHSWSP Committee, the Executive Board may treat such acts as a violation by the school/club of the Rule of the Association. Any school/club whose students, supporters, rooters, or partisans take part in riots, fights, pilfering, painting, jumping in the pool or any other unsportsmanlike conduct shall be subject to penalty.
- h) The Tournament Committee may remove any athlete, coach, or spectator from the tournament facility for violations of the "Conduct and Discipline" section. For any other reason the Committee feels is necessary to insure that the tournament is not disrupted or the safety of athletes and fans is not jeopardized



Water Polo Glossary:

30-second shot clock –, a team has 30 seconds to shoot the ball. The clocks are usually located at the edge of the pool.

Advantage rule – A cornerstone of water polo which permits a referee to refrain from declaring a foul if, in their opinion, such a declaration would be an advantage to the offender's team. Applied properly, it speeds up the game and results in more scoring.

Backhand – A pass or shot, made with either a bent or a straight arm, in which the ball is projected directly behind the thrower.

Ball under – An ordinary foul. Taking or holding the ball under when an opponent makes bodily contact with the shoulder, arm or hand.

Caps – Identification caps with plastic ear guards and visible numbers worn by all players. Usually one team wears white and the other wears blue. Goalkeeper's caps must be red.

Choice of ends – The decision about which goal to defend, determined by the toss of a coin. In pools with one end deep and one end shallow, it is believed to be an advantage to attack the deep end in the final period.

Corner Throw – Offensive player putting the ball into play at the 2-meter mark on the side nearest to which the opponent caused the ball to cross the goal line.

Counter attack – Offensive strategy that seeks to create a fast break or advantage situation at the offensive end after a turnover by the opponent in the defensive end.

Dead time – Usually refers to the time between the whistle for a foul, which stops the clock, and the restarting of the clock after the ball is put in play.

Bunny (donut) - A goal that is scored by a hard shot that is aimed close to the goalie's head.

Dribbling – The technique of moving and controlling the ball while swimming freestyle (front crawl stroke).

Drive - Quick swimming movement made toward the goal by an offensive player without the ball.

Drop – Almost a zone defense, where the defensive players drop back to help protect the center of the pool and help block shots. The Ball carrier must be pressured to force a bad pass or hurried shot.

Dry pass – A pass made where there is a need for a quick reception by the receiver and the ball may be caught without touching the water.

Eggbeater – The alternating leg kick, like a breast stroke kick, that enable players to lift themselves vertically out of the water while constantly treading water.

Ejection area – An area behind the goal line, opposite from the desk and beside the time bench, where penalty time is served by a player who has committed an exclusion foul.

Faking (or balking) – A body, head, or eye movement, or combination of these, which freeze a defensive player or makes them leave defensive positioning, to the advantage of the offensive player.

Field player – A player other than the goalie.

Flat – They are in the pool generally positioned 5 to 8 meters out from the goal posts. The "flat" is the position from which most "drives" are initiated.



Default (Forfeit) – When a team fails to comply with the rules, or decided not to complete a game for any reason, or fails to appear. The referee may declare the game a forfeit and the score will be recorded 5-0.

Free throw – The method of putting the ball in play after a team is awarded the ball by the referee after a foul (dropping from a raised hand onto the surface of the water or throwing into the air).

Fronting – Defensive positioning whereby the 2-meter guard gets in the passing lane (between the ball and the center forward), thereby preventing the center forward from receiving a pass.

Goal throw – A free throw awarded to the goalkeeper after a member of the offensive team has caused the ball to go out of bounds across the goal line..

Greenie – A vertical, quick shot taken by a perimeter player following a pass from the 2-meter position. Pass and shot are taken quickly in an effort to "catch" the perimeter defender and goalkeeper by surprise.

Holding, sinking, grabbing and/or pulling back a player who is "holding the ball" is not a foul so long as it is not done in a manner likely to injure the offensive player.

Man-down/man-up (6-on5 extra man) — When a defensive player commits a major foul and is ejected for 20 seconds, the offensive team has a "man" advantage.

Natural goal – A goal scored from open play when both teams are at full strength, as opposed to a goal scored from a penalty throw or a man-up situation.

Outlet – A pass from the goalie to a field player after a save to begin a counterattack.

Penalty shot (penalty throw) – Free shot at the goal, taken upon the signal of the referee, from any point along the 5-meter line with only the goalkeeper between the shooter and the goal.

Personal foul – A foul that results in exclusion or a penalty shot. Any player committing three personal fouls is excluded from the remainder of the game.

Press – The basic "man to man" defense that is the most commonly used strategy. The idea is to guard each offensive player tightly without fouling. Defenders should always position themselves between their goal and the player they are guarding.

Red markers – the line 2-meters from the goal line.

Slough (pronounced sluff) - A defensive strategy whereby a defensive player drops off the attacker they are guarding to adopt a position to guard an offensive player who is attacking from a more dangerous position.

Stationary pick – When an offensive player swims a defender into another (usually unseen) offensive player, similar to setting a screen in basketball.

Swim-off – The players taking up positions on their respective goal lines and swimming toward the ball at the center of the pool at the blast of the referee's whistle. This occurs at the beginning of each period.

Wet shot - A shot that is attempted while the ball is controlled in the water, usually a quick wrist shot; also called an off-the-water shot.

Yellow markers – The line 5-meters from the goal line.

UNDERSTANDING WATER POLO

Water Polo is like a combination of many sports, and is played in a all deep pool 25x20 meters. You can learn about water polo very quickly if you appreciate the similarities between it and other games. However, the combination of unique aspects is what makes water polo so dynamic.

WHAT IS SO DIFFERENT ABOUT WATER POLO?

The main element: the game is played in water, which makes it difficult for the referee to see exactly what is going on underneath the surface of the water. Players may use subtle pushes and holds to improve their positions. Additionally, simply playing in the water adds a dimension of difficulty not found in other sports.

HOW PHYSICAL IS WATER POLO?

Another interesting point is the way water polo rules distinguish between degrees of physical contact. The four rules that deal with contact are: impeding (swimming over someone), pushing, holding, and brutality. With the exception of brutality (intentionally striking the opponent), these rules do not apply when an opponent is holding the ball. In other words, they can be tackled. However, impeding and pushing are generally considered minor or ordinary fouls. To hold, sink or pull back an opponent not holding the ball is considered a major foul.

HOW IS WATER POLO SIMILAR TO OTHER GAMES?

Soccer

- Players score through rectangular goals defended by a goalkeeper.
- There are three types of free kicks/throws: Indirect – Ordinary foul inside the 7-meter (green mare, in water polo); no shot allowed. Direct – Ordinary foul outside the 7-meter; immediate shot at goal is permitted. Penalty – For any major fouls within the penalty area (four-meter) that would have prevented a probable goal.
- Offside This only applies in water polo when the player is inside the area two (2) meters in front of the goal. Of course, a player cannot be offside when he/she is in possession of the ball.

BASKETBALL

- Teams must shoot at a goal within an allotted amount of time after gaining possession. In water polo, it is a 35-secont shot clock.
- There are two types of fouls:
 Ordinary These are like violations in basketball and penalize minor breaches of the rules.
 Major These are like personal fouls in basketball. In water polo, they result in a "kick out" which creates an extra-man opportunity, or a penalty shot.
- In water polo, players get three (3) major fouls before they are removed from the game. In basketball, a player who is charged with five (5) fouls (high school and college) or six (6) fouls (professional) is then removed from the game. An unlimited number of minor or ordinary fouls are permitted in water polo.
- The clock is stopped every time the referee blows the whistle, extending the game from four periods of seven minutes (28 minutes of game time) to about and hour of elapsed time.
- In basketball, a player takes a position close to the basket or goal. This player is called the center, and his position is called the post. The function of this player is to score, or distribute the ball to other players (forwards, and guards) who will score. Water polo's equivalent position is the center forward, "hole-set", "hole", or "2-meter". This position tries to take up position in front of the opponent's goal, two meters away at the offside line.

ICE HOCKEY

Players are sent to the penalty box if they are assessed a major foul, except in the case of a penalty shot. In water polo, players are sent out of the playing area for 20 seconds, until a goal is scored, or the defending team regains possession. The exclusion area is in the corner of the playing area.

RUGBY

- Water polo is a contact sport, and a player holding the ball may be tackled, provided the player is making a play for the ball.
- The rules protect players from excessive violence. In water polo, when the ball is released by a player in possession of the ball, there is often a foul and a free pass, provided the player who was fouled has control of the ball.

DID YOU KNOW....that you have to start the game with seven players in the water, one of the players has to be a goalie?
